## Advent and Christmas Are Coming!

Here we are again in November and out ahead there is Thanksgiving and then—*then*—Christmas. Does that sound exciting or, maybe....daunting? Well, that's probably because we remember the nervous energy that drives us through it all. The busyness. The hustle. The last-minute-wrapping. The beauty of the first snowfall (or at least the movie version on the *Hallmark Channel*). The delight of Christmas lights (after they are hung, of course). The would-you-stop-arguing-we're-supposed-to-be-making-memories moments! There is so much desire and longing wrapped up in every gift, every have-to-make recipe, and every required tradition. We hope to create a Christmas for our families and loved ones but we are tired even before we're finished imagining it. But what if—*what if*—we could take all those dreams and plans and see what's underneath? What we would find, I believe, are our hopes for peace and joy and love for ourselves, our families, and for our world. And we say, "Lord, show us again how this goes? How can this busy, crazy time of year bless our lives and our lives together?"

One way is to live the seasons as the church has given them to

us. There is Advent, a season marked by expectation and preparation. What big life event does not need preparation? And what grand occasion doesn't have excitement and anticipation?

So too with Advent. It's the beginning of the church calendar. In the church, the year does not begin with resolutions for a "new me" in the new year, but with the hopeful anticipation of the birth of a little baby who will come to make all things new.

Advent has with it a certain tone. We hear it. The music of Advent expresses a longing, a thirst—and the relief we will experience when it is satisfied. Take this hymn, for example. It looks to Jesus not only as God's love expressed in human form in Jesus: *"Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set Thy people free; from our fears and sins release us, let us find our rest in thee. Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth thou art; dear desire of ev'ry nation, joy of ev'ry longing heart."* Advent music can capture the hard things about life here in the not-yet, before Christ comes to restore all things.

Then there's Christmas. We celebrate with a new kind of joy

this great turning upside down; not us reaching out, searching for God but God coming to Earth in the form of a human baby.

I invite you to Advent and Christmas at Peace! Come again with me as we draw near to all that his holy, all that is hard about Advent and Christmas. Come again to practice hope for the coming King. Celebrating generosity and love any chance we get. Come again to know how much God loves you. As Henri Nouwen once wrote: *"The Lord is coming, always coming. When you have ears to hear and eyes to see, you will recognize him at any moment of your life. Life is Advent; life is recognizing the coming of the Lord."*

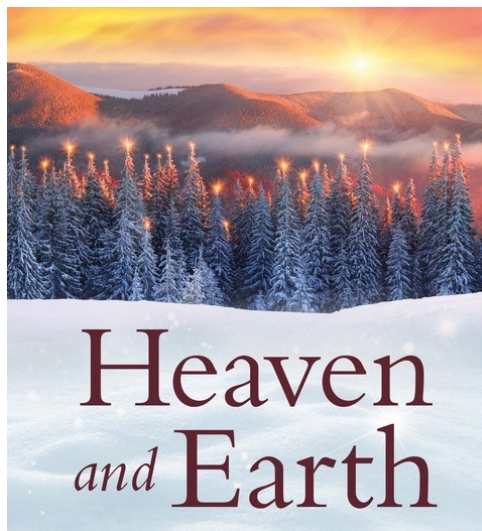

### **“The New Testament in Seven Sentences.” January 3, 10, 17, 24, 2024**

All of us have been on a car trip. We go through valleys and towns; going east, west, north, or south; and we're not really sure where we are and where we're going! Take a plane trip instead? It's all different! We can see with a larger lens how things are connected.

Something like that happens while reading and hearing the New Testament, too. We hear about Jesus' activities (a miracle, a confrontation) or his teaching (a parable, a conversation). But without a larger picture, those things lose their importance and we're not sure how they are connected. Only a view from 30,000 feet will help us to see the whole context with an accurate perspective and get some new meaning about our Christian faith.

In this 4-week session, we'll cover seven sentences that are essential if we are to understand the New Testament. Join in!

# Meaning-Making During the Holidays

What makes for a meaningful holiday season? Is it the snow? The gifts? The food? The decorations? The family time? The church services? Something else entirely?



an Advent calendar and lighting candles. There are many ways that we can be intentional about how we make meaning from what could be considered mundane.

The more I learn about creating meaningful experiences—as a family, in faith formation, or just in general—there are a few factors that remain true across the board.

First, it's important to build a solid foundation of consistency. We do this by creating steady rhythms and routines in our daily lives—the things that ground us and become habits and natural practices. For example, in the fall, we build the routine of going to school during the week, then coming home to eat dinner as a family, and saying a prayer together beforehand. In Advent we can mark the days and weeks with

Conversely, in order for something to feel special, there needs to be a break in the routine—it needs to feel different than usual. This is where Advent and Christmas come in. Starting with Thanksgiving and continuing through December, we have special meals together, with people who are special to us, gathered around a table. We take breaks from school and activities to dedicate to this holy act of being together. And yes, the giving and receiving of gifts adds to the excitement, fun, and joy as well.

Thus, in the end, it's a mix of all those aforementioned things.

There's a sense of magic when the snow falls; the decorations and lights fill us with wonder; the special church services and family traditions ground us in the past, present, and future; the people we spend quality time with remind us of the peace, hope, joy, and love that exists in our hearts and in the world.

So as we move into this beloved time of year, make it meaningful first in the everyday, building consistent ways of sharing love. And as you gather for Christmas festivities, keeping Jesus at the center, know that it will be special and memorable—not because any specific thing that happened or was given, but because of the intentionality and care put into celebrating the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

All registrations except for Vacation Bible School will open on Monday, January 15, 2024 and close on Thursday, February 15, 2024.

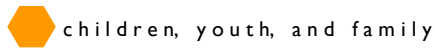

## Confirmation

On Friday, November 10<sup>th</sup>, our Confirmation students had the privilege of visiting Temple Israel, a Jewish synagogue in Minneapolis. Temple Israel describes themselves as an “urban congregation dedicated to serving a diverse community,” and it was actually the first synagogue established in Minneapolis. Additionally, it’s currently one of the ten largest Jewish congregations in the United States.

We began the evening with a tour of the synagogue and

some conversation time with our host, Jonathan. After, we joined them in worship for their Friday night Shabbat service. While most Christian churches gather for worship on Sunday mornings, Jews honor the Sabbath from Friday evenings to Saturday evenings. Temple Israel describes Shabbat as an invitation “to take a break from our daily lives to nourish our souls and reconnect with our community.”

Similar to Christians, Jews share the Hebrew Bible/Old Testament as a sacred text;

along with Christianity and Islam, they are an Abrahamic religion. However, though they are monotheistic, Jews are not Trinitarian—they do not believe in the Holy Spirit and consider Jesus only as a prophet.

We are grateful for Temple Israel’s gracious hospitality and for the wonderful experience we got to share together as a group!

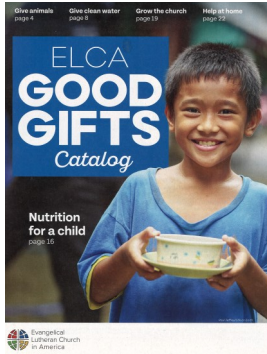

For the second year, a Peace school teacher encountered refugee children from South America coming to school without winter clothing, and wanted to do something about it.

With your Benevolence money, she focused on 35 elementary students and volunteered to go on a shopping spree to buy new

coats, hats, mittens, snow pants, boots, and whatever else was needed, for those that had none. Every student was given the clothes they needed and the right sizes too.

A social worker in the school later remarked that the children liked their boots so much they didn't want to take them off. One third grader

didn't want the merchandise tags cut off; he had never had anything new before.

What a wonderful thing to do, and what a thrill it is to spread some joy in this world. Thank you Peace for consecrating some of your offerings to Benevolence, allowing us to be the Hands and Feet of Christ.

- 1.) I own more than one Christmas sweater (bonus point if they are ugly).
- 2.) I have Christmas-themed earrings.
- 3.) Even my pets have stockings.
- 4.) I watch 11+ Christmas movies in December.
- 5.) I force my family or friends to wear matching pajamas, and
- 6.) I drive around for more than an hour to find Christmas lights.

Now, add up your score. If you didn't answer “yes” to any, you're a Christmas Grinch. If you scored, 0-3, you're a great Christmas Cindy Lou Hoo (Remember her from *How the Grinch Stole Christmas?*) and you have a good balance of managing this over-the-top season with a calm spirit. If you said “yes” to 4-6 items, you are the spirit of Christmas...in the flesh!



As we experience Advent and Christmas, there is something of that Christmas spirit in each of us. We want the Christmas season to feel like magic. But then life happens. The dog or cat pulls down the Christmas tree. Or I am in too much pain to go to the Christmas gathering. Or a flight gets canceled. Or the traditional family fight causes everyone to leave the room. The magic of the season doesn't erase our regular problems. The chronic pain or doctor's appointments or alcoholism or mental health issue.

The chaos of Christmas can feel anything but peaceful or perfect. And yet, this is the season we celebrate the coming of the Prince of Peace, a peace that is put in place, not through armies or laws but through the tiny baby, Jesus. Truly that is peace that surpasses understanding. So this is the Christmas we actually have—sometimes messy, sometimes frustrating, and sometimes wonderfully joyful. May we make room for the Prince of Peace in every imperfect moment.
